Trailmarkers

Last Saturday night, when I finally gave up hope that Ohio State might come back against Wisconsin, I turned off the game and put *The Sound of Music* into the dvd player to watch for a half hour as an antidote to the disappointment of the game. I can't remember a time when I did not know this movie. It has become a part of our cultural landscape. And although it is not a movie that is remembered for being contentious, I want to remind you of an argument that is particularly good.

If you don't know the story, it involves the widower father of seven children, who has made his house a model of rigid order since the death of his wife. He associates the children's sounds of laughter, music, and play with the painful memories of his wife, and so he has decided to parent his children the way he used to command his ship as a naval commander (i.e. blows a whistle to summon his children). He arranges with the local convent to send a novitiate named Maria to serve as governess, and she secretly plays with the children and teaches them to sing.

If you know the movie, then you may remember the scene when the father discovers her secrets and they have a heated argument. He condemns her for disobeying his orders, and having said the last word, he tells her that he doesn't want to hear anymore. She yells back at him "I know you don't want to but you've got to," or something like that. She wants him to see how desperately the children desire his love and approval, but he wants to run his house as he sees fit, and he fires her on the spot.

He storms into the house, where he is surprised to hear his children, all seven of them, singing a beautiful song together. His demeanor changes, and he recovers something that he had locked away for too long. To their great surprise, he enters the room and begins to sing with them. He keeps Maria on as governess, and then, of course, they...(well, if you haven't seen it, you really should).

The point I want to make is that his mind was changed by a gift of beauty and joy in a way that it never could be changed by argument. Faith works the same way. We come to God by invitation, by the compelling goodness of God's gifts. It is rare for someone to become faithful because of an argument.

CHRISTMAS QUILT

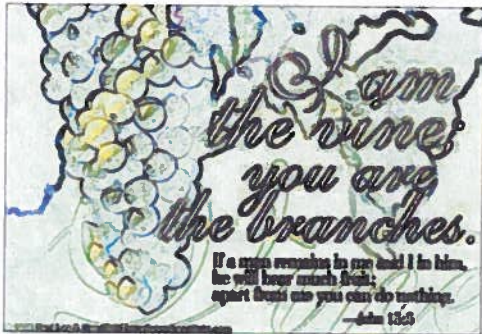

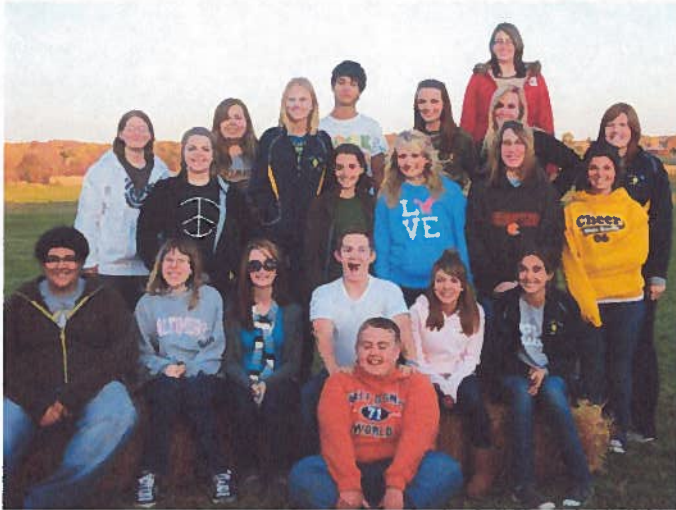

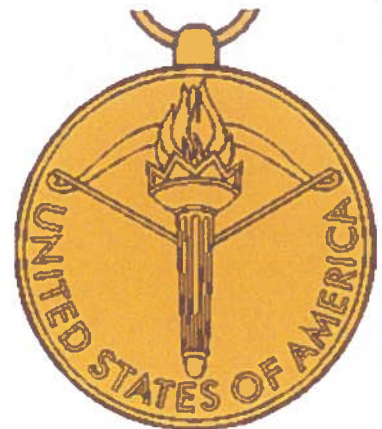
