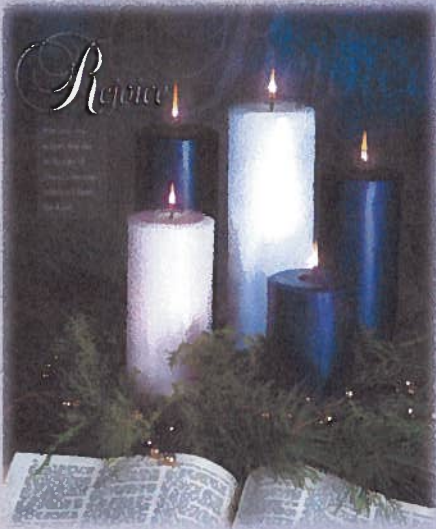
The Family Service will also include carols and the lighting of candles. All ages are welcome to this 45 minute service.

Dear Friends,

In a few days we will celebrate the birth of Jesus on December 25th. It was the Roman Catholic Church that determined in the 4th century to make December 25th (according to some sources) as the date of celebrating the birth of Jesus. The Orthodox Christian Churches celebrate the birth of Jesus on January 7th, while the Armenian Apostolic Church celebrates the birth on January 6th and other orthodox churches celebrate on January 19th. The importance of the date is eclipsed by the event – God came in the person of Jesus – that is what is central to *all* Christians.


It is not coincidental that the birth of Jesus is celebrated in the month of December so near the winter solstice, or the darkest day of the year. (The birth of John the Baptist is believed to be on the summer solstice, or six months prior to Jesus' birth.) Jesus is described as the "Light of the World" coming to a darkened world bringing the light of hope and promise. We decorate our evergreen trees and our homes with lights to remind us of the fulfilled promise of God in Jesus.

Christmas brings us together in friendship and summons families to gather together. Separations become more acute and pronounced during this season. The celebration is an expression of our religious faith and the word *religious* comes from the word "*religio*" which means "connection to the Divine" and we connect with others in community. Christmas cards, letters, church events, parties, dinners and church services of worship are meant to bring us together in a community to remember and reflect on God's presence and God's promise in Jesus Christ.

"No matter where you are on life's journey you are welcome here..." Rev. Wooster and I proclaim each Sunday before we enter the time of worship *"...Whether you have a certain faith or many questions; whether you are filled with joy or walking through the valley of shadows, you are welcome in this sanctuary."* This *is* the Christmas story lived out at First Congregational Church, the living story that reminds us of God's faithful promise in Jesus Christ and that we follow him.

Beth and I wish each of you a Merry Christmas and a blessed New Year.

Every person goes about their lives day after day with burdens of grief, worry, loneliness, frustration, anger, and many others. These burdens are unseen and mostly unknown to others. If we could ever see these burdens, we would be much kinder and gentler to every person we meet, whether at work, school, or in the grocery store.

There are many places where it is not safe for us to show our burdens. Most of the time, we have to tell people that we are fine. "I'm fine, thanks. How are you?" We have to tell people that because being honest might cause us harm, especially if we feel ignored, or judged, or patronized. So we keep it inside.

I believe that we create a sacred space in the church family. This sacred space is strong enough to handle the burdens we carry. This sacred space allows us to be honest. This sacred space lets us know that we are not alone in being sad, scared, ashamed, or bitter. We are not expected to have our lives put together on our own, and so we turn to God, and we receive God's support in the arms of the church family.

There are many people who hold the sacred space in this church, including the Board of Deacons, Prayer Chain Ministry, Stephen Ministers, Hearts in Service, Life's Journey Ministry, Yarning for Peace, the Warrior's Journey Home, and many small group and individual relationships. You don't have to carry the burdens alone.

When we read the nativity story in the gospel according to Matthew, we learn that there are two types of kings. King #1 is King Herod. King Herod serves under the Roman Emperor as the appointed "King of the Jews," responsible for keeping order and generating prosperity in the region of Judea. It's good work if you can get it. Herod enjoys luxury and power, and he is protected by Roman soldiers. Now, there's nothing wrong with peace and security, fresh fruit for breakfast and a nicely roasted bird for dinner - these are among God's gifts. But this type of King is selfish, and ruthless in defending his own privileges. When the magi come from the east, they tell of a new King of the Jews, whose birth was written in the stars. King Herod asks the magi to find the baby and report back to him, so that he may also go and pay homage. The magi are warned of his duplicity, and when they do not return with the location details, King Herod kills every newborn boy in order to protect himself from a rival king. Dishonesty, cruelty, and the death of innocents. Some people will cause great harm in order to protect their own position.

King #2 is Jesus. He is not a king appointed by the emperor, but announced in the night sky, and proclaimed in the hearts of those who choose to follow him. This type of king also enjoys peace, and savors the best gifts in life: good food and drink, meals with friends and neighbors, and with anyone who was hungry. He does not live in luxury, but he is content with each day.

This type of King is selfless. He does not defend his own privileges, but gives them up in order to serve others. He is more interested in giving than receiving, and his gifts ease hunger, heal pain, restore community, and save the world.

When the Magi visit the baby Jesus, they have made their choice about which King to honor. Christmas is a time to answer that question once again for ourselves. Which King do we want to honor in the way we live?
